

General Conduct Policy

The Library Board of Trustees has adopted the following code of conduct to provide a safe, comfortable, and enjoyable library facility.

- Any conduct that disrupts the delivery of library services or hinders others from using library materials or receiving library services is prohibited. (Massachusetts General Laws, Ch. 272, Sec. 41)
- Any conduct that is potentially abusive or harmful to library personnel or patrons, materials or facilities is prohibited.
- The use of false identification to obtain a library card or to check out library materials, or use of another person's library card without his or her permission, is against state law. (Massachusetts General Laws, Ch. 266, Sec. 99)
- Theft, defacement, or damage of library materials or property is against state law. (Massachusetts General Laws, Ch. 266, Sec.99 and 100)
- Parents can be held liable for damage done by a child under the age of 18. (Massachusetts General Laws, Ch. 231, Sec. 85G)
- Consumption of tobacco products, marijuana and e-cigarettes is prohibited in the Library and on Library property.

(Massachusetts General Laws, Ch. 270, Sec. 22, and LEED certification requirement)

- Sleeping is not permitted in the Library.
- Patrons must enter the library wearing shoes and shirts, and must not have offensive body odor or personal hygiene or be otherwise attired in a way that is disruptive to the library environment.
- Headsets or cell phones in use must not be audible to others.

Library staff is authorized to enforce this code, and to call for police assistance and/or contact a parent or guardian when necessary. The Library reserves the right to revoke or restrict Library privileges in cases of violation of the code of conduct.
